**Just how much Senate experience does Barack Obama have in terms of actual work days?
Does that really make him qualified for the highest office in the land and leader of the free world?**

Senator Barack Obama spent only the 109th Congress (Jan. 2005-Dec. 2006) of 272 session days of which he missed 8, and only 6 days into the 110th Congress (Jan. 2007-Dec. 2008) before declaring his ambitions for the Presidency of the United States, by announced his presidential exploratory committee on January 16, 2007 to be the Commander-in-Chief and the Leader of the Free World. That is 270 days of experience working on the job as a U.S. Senator. He has missed 128 days of the 322 session days since making his announcement to run for the Presidency. He has campaigned as of Oct. 1st already 625 days, minus the nearly 2 months of vacations just this year because the campaigning was too strenuous. That is already 230% or 2 1/3 times more time then he spent in the U.S. Senate where he was supposed to be doing the work he was elected and is paid to do, and had to be forced to leave the campaign trail only with a Presidential summons in order to deal with the economic crisis.

For those who may not fully grasps the ramifications of such scant experience, consider that:

- ❖ You couldn't become the CEO of a corporation after 270 days working in middle management.
- ❖ You couldn't become Chief of Surgery or any type of doctor after spending just 270 days.
- ❖ Nor could you become the Superintendent of Schools after 270days of being a teacher.
- ❖ You can't even go through Boot Camp and MOS Training in 270 days.
- ❖ In fact, it even takes more than 270 days for a fetus to gestate and be birthed.

And, during that time, he did not sponsor a single piece of substantial legislation or acquire a reputation for any legislative achievement whatsoever. Curiously, Senator Obama himself stated at a news conference after winning his Senate seat that he would NOT run for President, citing two things: lack of experience and the need to begin campaigning immediately. The good news is that as voters, we have common sense, and we have the power of our vote come Election Day. Senator Obama is simply not fit to be President of the United States. He DOESN'T HAVE the experience or ability to lead and everyone knows it.
